Children and families in the slums of Kampala face many complex barriers and often live in extreme poverty. Families break down, children are abused, traumatised and abandoned, many are not able to afford school. Girls and women are particularly vulnerable to marginalisation and exploitation.

Children's lives are transformed, communities are empowered, families become economically and emotionally resilient, poverty is reduced and more people are self-sufficient and independent.

We provide a network of safeguarding support to prevent child abuse and protect children in danger, aiding with social justice cases, responding to emergencies, looking after children in need of emergency care, providing family-based care for children wherever possible and child focused mediation for families
