We have been blessed to welcome a number of new staff to our team this year. Nicole as our Charity Development Officer and Karen as our Fundraising and Events Officer. In July Nicole joined Corrie in visiting our projects and children in Uganda. Our volunteer team has also grown with Rosie as our Fundraising Intern and Miriam, Linda and Jess as Fundraising Ambassadors.

We expanded to a new slum community, Naguru, enabling hundreds more vulnerable children to benefit from our kids clubs, education, feeding and community development services. We are excited to announce that we have been awarded a prestigious funding grant from UKAid to support our Education projects and we are looking forward to what we can achieve thanks to this support.

Sadly in November our offices in Uganda were broken into and many of our laptops and other equipment were stolen. 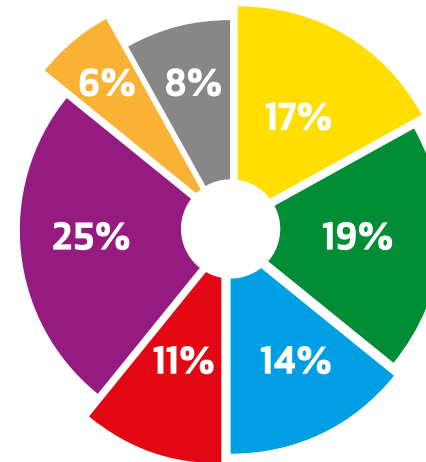

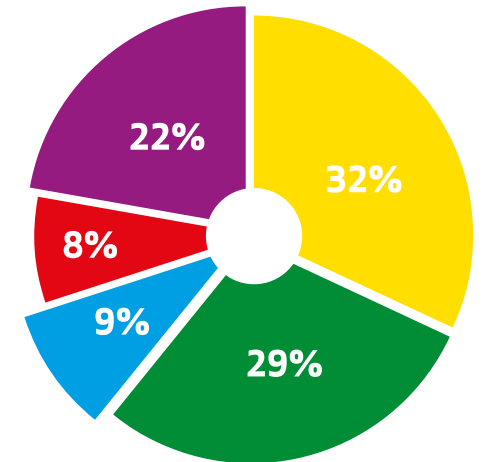

We believe that children belong in loving families. The Ewafe Project rescues children from abandonment, abuse and harm and reintegrates them with loving families wherever possible.

Miriam* (10) and her siblings Jenny* (9) and Ben* (7) found themselves with nowhere to live when their mother was suffering from mental health problems and was admitted to hospital. They had no one to turn to. Both Jenny and Ben also suffer from sickle cell and were becoming unwell. Our Ewafe project gave them a safe place to live and took care of their medical and practical needs. Over the next few months our social workers worked with the family including their Aunt to make a plan for the children to return home. Their mother is now out of hospital and with the additional help from their Aunt who now lives with them and regular support from our social workers they were able to return home. Another family back together.

Transforming Communities

With the help of SIDshare and the Uganda WC Project we provided a community with an eco-friendly composting toilet.

In 2018 we continued to bring free carpentry training to young men to give them a skill for life. 6 young men graduated with a skill.
